QUICK REVIEW

Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time or that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

ENGAGE WITH THE MESSAGE

- This weekend, we were reminded to honor God by submitting to earthly authorities, doing good in our community, and using our freedom to be His slave. Which of these do you find easy to do? Which of these do you find difficult to do? Explain.
- Peter summarizes his thoughts in verse 17, "Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor." Practically speaking, what does this look like in everyday life?
- Looking at the six points of Edwards' theology of public life for the Christian, which one do you think the church, in general, is doing well? Which one is the church not doing well? What practical things can we do in these six areas to be better witnesses in our community?

DIGGING DEEPER

Matthew 17:24-27, ESV – ²⁴ When they came to Capernaum, the collectors of the two-drachma tax went up to Peter and said, "Does your teacher not pay the tax?" ²⁵ He said, "Yes." And when he came into the house, Jesus spoke to him first, saying, "What do you think, Simon? From whom do kings of the earth take toll or tax? From their sons or from others?" ²⁶ And when he said, "From others," Jesus said to him, "Then the sons are free. ²⁷ However, not to give offense to them, go to the sea and cast a hook and take the first fish that comes up, and when you open its mouth you will find a shekel. Take that and give it to them for me and for yourself."

For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. ² Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment. ³ For rulers are not a terror to good act, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive oproval, ⁴ for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. ⁵ Therefore one must subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience. ⁶ For because of this you also pay, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. ⁷ Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to a taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is
